POLICY: 500.10

INTERVIEWS OF STUDENTS BY OUTSIDE AGENCIES

The District will reasonably cooperate with law enforcement agencies and the Department of Human

Services when they find it necessary to interview students at school.

When possible, such interviews should occur outside of the school setting. When in-school interviews are

necessary, these guidelines are to be followed for: (a) law enforcement interviews...a student may only be

interviewed at school if directed by a court order; upon receiving the consent of the parent/guardian; or if the

student is eighteen years old and agrees to the interview. If the student to be interviewed is not a suspect and the

parent/quardian cannot be reached, the Principal may approve of the interview if he/she deems it essential to the

welfare of a student or the school; and (b) Department of Human Services interviews...an alleged victim of child

abuse may be interviewed without contacting the parents/quardians. The D.H.S. investigator will determine who

shall be present at the interview. School officials are under no obligation to report to the parent/guardian about the

interview.

Pursuant to seeing an appropriate warrant, court order, or other legal process, school officials shall allow

no student to be taken from school by law enforcement or D.H.S. personnel without the notification of the

parent/quardian or unless the student is eighteen years of age and gives consent.
