### A STUDENT'S DUE PROCESS RIGHTS

Each student, before any disciplinary action is taken against the student, has a right to due process as guaranteed by our Constitution. A student, who is accused of a breach of discipline and threatened with punishment, has the right to a hearing with the Building Principal or designee. After the hearing is held and the student is still dissatisfied, he/she may have a hearing with the Superintendent. After that hearing and the student is still dissatisfied, he/she may request a hearing with the Board. If a student is dissatisfied with the decision of the Board the next level of appeal is to the Director of Iowa Department of Education. The student's parents/guardians may attend any of the hearings.
