

ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION

Alternative education programming for students shall be provided for those unable to function effectively in a regular school setting. Such alternatives may include, but are not limited to: (a) an altered school day; (b) enrollment into the Alternative High School; (c) home-schooling; (d) periodic tutorial assistance; (e) an extended-day; and (f) a student assistance program.

Pregnant students may continue their educational program during pregnancy in the regular school setting. Another option for pregnant students is to receive their education at a program set apart from the normal school-setting. This option is available only for the term of pregnancy. The student is then expected to return to the regular school setting as soon as the student is physically and emotionally ready.

Any alternative educational programming shall be consistent with the expectations and requirements (e.g., graduation requirements, regular attendance) of students enrolled in a regular school setting.
